Botanical Name:

Chimonanthus praecox Common Name: fragrant


wintersweet ·Height: 10-15' ·Spread: 8-12'

Flower: small, fragrant yellowish white blooms in winter to early spring

·Site: Sun or filtered shade, needs good drainage.

·Leaf: Opposite, simple, lustrous dark green leaves; 3-6" long; yellow-green fall color.

Chimonanthus praecox is a must-have for the winter garden where space allows. A large growing shrub, it specializes in blooming at a time few other plants do, typically beginning in late December and continuing sporadically throughout the winter. Once you take in the fragrance of its many small, yellow blooms you'll never forget searching for the source of the perfume. Excellent winter interest plant for the back of the border.





GREENSBORO BEAUTIFUL RECEIVES LEAD GIFT FOR HAMBURGER SQUARE RENOVATION PROJECT

Christman Company Encourages Other Businesses to Follow Suit

In a brief ceremony on January 15, leaders of The Christman Company presented a check for \$50,000 to Greensboro Beautiful as the lead gift in the \$375,000 Renovation of Hamburger Square, the 50th anniversary project of GBI. Accepting the check on behalf of GBI was Dan Smith, Chair of the organization's board of directors; along with Yvonne Johnson, Mayor Pro-Tem and an Honorary Chair of the project.

Christman President and CEO Steve Roznowski described the gift as a part of Christman's "Be Constructive" giving and volunteerism program, with its mission of making a positive impact in the communities in which its employees live and work. "We are proud to continue our partnerships and investment in Greensboro in this way; and we strongly encourage others to step up and do the same. This is going to be a beautiful addition to the neighborhood; and we're looking forward to our team members not only providing some hands-on help with the project, but enjoying the fruits of those labors as well."

In 2018, Greensboro Beautiful celebrated its 50th anniversary. Dan Smith, Chair of the Board says, "Choosing to beautify this central location demonstrates our commitment to every area of Greensboro. With Christman's renovation of the Cascade Saloon, the timing is perfect. We are grateful for their contribution."

The restoration of Hamburger Square coincides with The Cascade Saloon restoration and a burgeoning South End district, which includes arts and entrepreneur spaces, retailers, and restaurants. Beautification provides the footing for additional private development.

NEIGHBORWOODS TO KICK OFF IN KINGS FOREST PARK ON ARBOR DAY

Kings Forest neighborhood in northeast Greensboro has been awarded Greensboro Beautiful's 2019 NeighborWoods Community Tree Planting. Greensboro Beautiful and Parks and Recreation will meet with Kings Forest residents to get their ideas and input on Kings Forest Park improvements at a community meeting at 6:30 pm, Thursday, February 21 at Peeler Recreation Center, 1300 Sykes Ave.

A ceremonial tree planting will be held in honor of Arbor Day at 10 am, Saturday, March 16 at Kings Forest Park. The park is located off Phillips Avenue between Larchmont Drive and Lord Foxley Drive.

The neighborhood suffered massive losses to its tree canopy last year when a tornado cut a path of destruction through the area, downing and damaging trees, and devastating the neighborhood park. The NeighborWoods program will assist neighbors in replacing and replanting trees lost to the storms, both in the park and throughout the neighborhood.

Greensboro is a Tree City USA community and Greensboro Beautiful has been helping to beautify the city for 50 years. NeighborWoods is a project of Greensboro Beautiful, in partnership with the City of Greensboro, the NC Cooperative Extension Service, and neighborhoods, to help rebuild our City's tree canopy, and bring neighborhoods together through an interaction with nature.

Featured speakers include:

- *Thomas Rainer, a registered landscape architect, teacher, and author living in Arlington, Virginia. He is a leading voice in ecological landscape design, and has designed landscapes for the U.S. Capitol grounds, the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial, and The New York Botanical Garden, as well as over 100 gardens from Maine to Florida. He is a Principal for the landscape architectural and consulting firm Phyto Studio, teaches at George Washington University, and is co-author of Planting in a Post-Wild World.
- John Lonsdale, owner of Edgewood Gardens, a rare plant nursery and garden in Exton, PA. Born in England, John has grown a wide variety of alpine and woodland plants and bulbs for more than 30 years He is a recipient of the Alpine Garden Society Gold Merit Medal, received his Ph.D. from the University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne in 1985, lectures widely, and his website features over 10,000 images of plants growing in his garden.
- Douglas Ruhren is currently Gardens Manager at the JC Raulston Arboretum at NC State University. He has also worked for the American Camellia Society, Daniel Stowe Botanical Gardens, Montrose Garden, and Chatwood Garden. He has designed display gardens and worked to preserve Elizabeth Lawrence's Charlotte garden. He is on the Garden Advisory committee for the now protected Elizabeth Lawrence Garden in Charlotte. Douglas and Edith Eddleman are restoring the Elizabeth Lawrence Border at the Raulston Arboretum.
